When to travel

This is intrinsically related to whether a safari is the primary reason for your holiday. Typically, in both Southern & East Africa, game-viewing is best in the dry months. Southern Africa - winter and spring months of June through to October East Africa – two rainy seasons with a drier climate in between. So June to mid-October and then December to mid-March (broadly speaking).

#### Why we recommend the dry season for your safari.

Animals need water and food. During the dry season there's less surface water and the vegetation is sparser, so animals are easier to spot especially around the remaining water sources. It's also a pleasant climate for game viewing with warm sunny (rather than scorching) days.

But we do understand that there may be other reasons for your travel timing that conflict with this, like escaping the chill of the northern hemisphere winter. This particularly goes for South Africa.

Keep in mind that there are often great slightly off season specials available, should your dates be flexible.

How much to spend

This can be a hard question to answer as ideally you don't want to skimp. Most safaris probably cost more than you want to spend at first glance.

We've outlined some helpful information below:

South Africa and Namibia probably give you the best value for money (as priced in Rands)

Botswana, Kenya and Tanzania are the most expensive

Rwanda is generally priced higher than Uganda due to the higher Gorilla permit price

Zambia and Zimbabwe are great alternatives to Botswana, due to the slightly lower price point

How long to spend?

- We recommend a minimum 10 12 nights in the country given the cost and time to get to Africa, you want to make the most of it all, once you're here.
- If you are visiting South Africa or Namibia for a varied trip, or if you want to do both safari and beach, then we recommend a minimum of 10-12 nights.
- Ideally, we recommend 12 -14 nights for the complete safari experience.
- If you are retired, or have generous leave, we recommend spending  $2\frac{1}{2}$  to 3 weeks.
- If your focus is purely on a safari experience, 6-8 nights can work.
- Overall, we recommend focusing on fewer destinations and having at least 2-3 nights in each, to minimize wasted travel time.

# TIPS

- Try to minimize travelling days by reducing the need for internal scheduled flights.
- A light charter flight will use up less time than scheduled flights.
- Self-drive usually needs a little more time than private touring, so its all up to balancing your time vs cost.
- Given that some lodges and hotels offer long stay offers, you may find that those extra nights don't add substantially to the cost and often staying longer can include benefits like complimentary intra-lodge transfers. All the more reason to work with safari experts!



Number of travellers

We have welcomed couples, families, and friends travelling together. Increasingly, we work with multi-generational families - three or more generations all coming together to explore, reconnect and enjoy the beauty of Africa.

### Here are some considerations to be aware of:

**Couples** – Everything is on offer. However some specialist private touring can be expensive for only a couple.

**Two Couples** – this works very well. Private touring is less expensive and many lodges offer two bedroom villas with identical en suite bedrooms.

**Multi-Generational families** – we see an increasing number of Multi-Generational families. A Private Villa or Safari House works very well. But often budget and a suitable range of activities also needs to be considered. Its also useful to know which lodges allow kids over 6, which over 12 and so on. And where the adults can enjoy a break while the young ones enjoy informative, supervised activities on offer at the lodge. And where a private vehicle is the best option so you can enjoy the safari at your own pace.

When to Book

Aim for at least **3 - 6 months in advance**, or even more if you want to go to a very popular area in peak season.

- 8-12 months You want to go to a popular area or in peak season. Or if you have specific places that you'd like to stay. Some places get booked up almost a year ahead.
- **4 -8 months** This is the most common booking period. Most places are available. But you may not always get your first choice. It pays to be a little flexible on dates if you want a specific lodge.
- 2 4 months Not recommended for the peak season such as July to October or Christmas. But should be possible in quieter months. Don't expect the most well-known and popular lodges to have space, however an experienced safari specialist like us will know of good substitutions.
- Less than a month Surprisingly, a good option as you don't have time to get lost in the options! Not every lodge will be available but if you are flexible, this can work for your safari plans.
